# Turning findings into action

During the last decade, Arctic Search and Rescue (SAR) entities and the Arctic expedition cruise industry have strengthened their collaboration through exercises and other activities. The five past Joint Arctic SAR TTX and Workshops are among these, as is the recent ARCSAR LIVEX in Svalbard. Other national and local initiatives, as well as operator individual initiatives adds to the list of exercises.

What all the exercises have in common, are findings. Every exercise has given valuable learnings and takeaways. There are many reports listing areas and issues that can gain from improvement and/or development.

The 2023 Joint Arctic SAR event will not include a Tabletop Exercise (TTX) but instead focus on how the SAR entities and the cruise industry can transform findings into actions.

On this background, the organizers invite participants to be part of a workshop where we will discuss solutions and the way forward, exchange ideas and develop actions points and recommendations.

The event will also include presentations and learnings from incidents and major developments throughout the Arctic. Finally, the event will include relevant SAR responder demonstrations.

#### Why a Joint Arctic SAR event?

Cruise industry representatives, SAR responders and others have described previous joint SAR events, as well as the collaboration between SAR responders and the cruise industry, as highly valuable for strengthening and further developing SAR preparedness and response in the Arctic.

This collaboration has improved the dialogue and cooperation across sectors, leading to a greater understanding of the competencies, capacities and capabilities of the different actors, including limitations and potentials.

The event has also consolidated its reputation as a highly important networking platform.
